Maine's Listed Bats



MESA listed

- Little brown bat – state endangered
- Northern long-eared bat – state endangered (and fed threatened)
- Eastern small-footed bat – state threatened

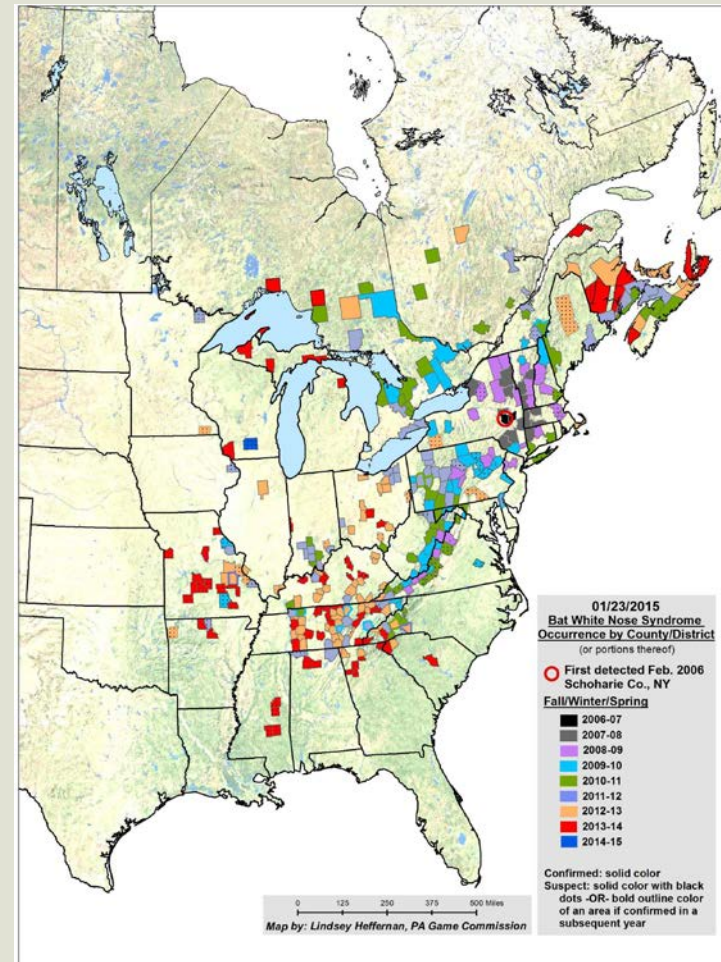


What drove listing



Disease

- *Pseudogymnoascus destructans* (Pd)
- Causal agent for White Nose Syndrome
- First documented NY 2006
- Spread across eastern NA



What drove listing



Evidence for listing

- 90–98% decline in hibernacula occurrence
- Evidence supported by
 - consultant data
 - other state reports
- Used information to petition legislature
- Officially listed October 15, 2015



Current Provisions



As MESA currently stands

- Protected from
 - take (killing in MESA terms)
 - harassment
- No essential habitat listed – may change
 - no known maternity sites
 - only 4 known hibernaculum already protected

Current Provisions



- First listing simultaneous with USFWS
 - desire mesh of state/fed regulations
- Provide protection during vulnerable life stages
 - maternity period
 - hibernation

Moving Forward



- Interest in protections/exemptions similar to federal 4-D
 - Legislative resolve brought forth by MFPC
 - report back to legislature by mid January
 - review identified need in MESA

Potential MESA Changes



- MESA was lacking
 - exemption for take by rule (general activities)
 - Incidental Take Permit (large group)
- MESA amendment drafted
 - currently in legislative process
 - If approved, official 90 days after closure

If Passed



- MESA would have two new provisions
 - 1) Exemption by rule under agreed conservation practices (ex. Federal 4-D)
 - ex. Tree harvesting
 - 2) Ability to create group ITP under conservation practices
 - ex. ADC, Mist Netters

Conclusion



- Maine is focusing protection on maternity and hibernacula
- Maternity sites unknown but may change
- Desire for state rules to mirror federal 4-D
- Potential MESA amendments provide 4-D and ITP provisions under MESA
